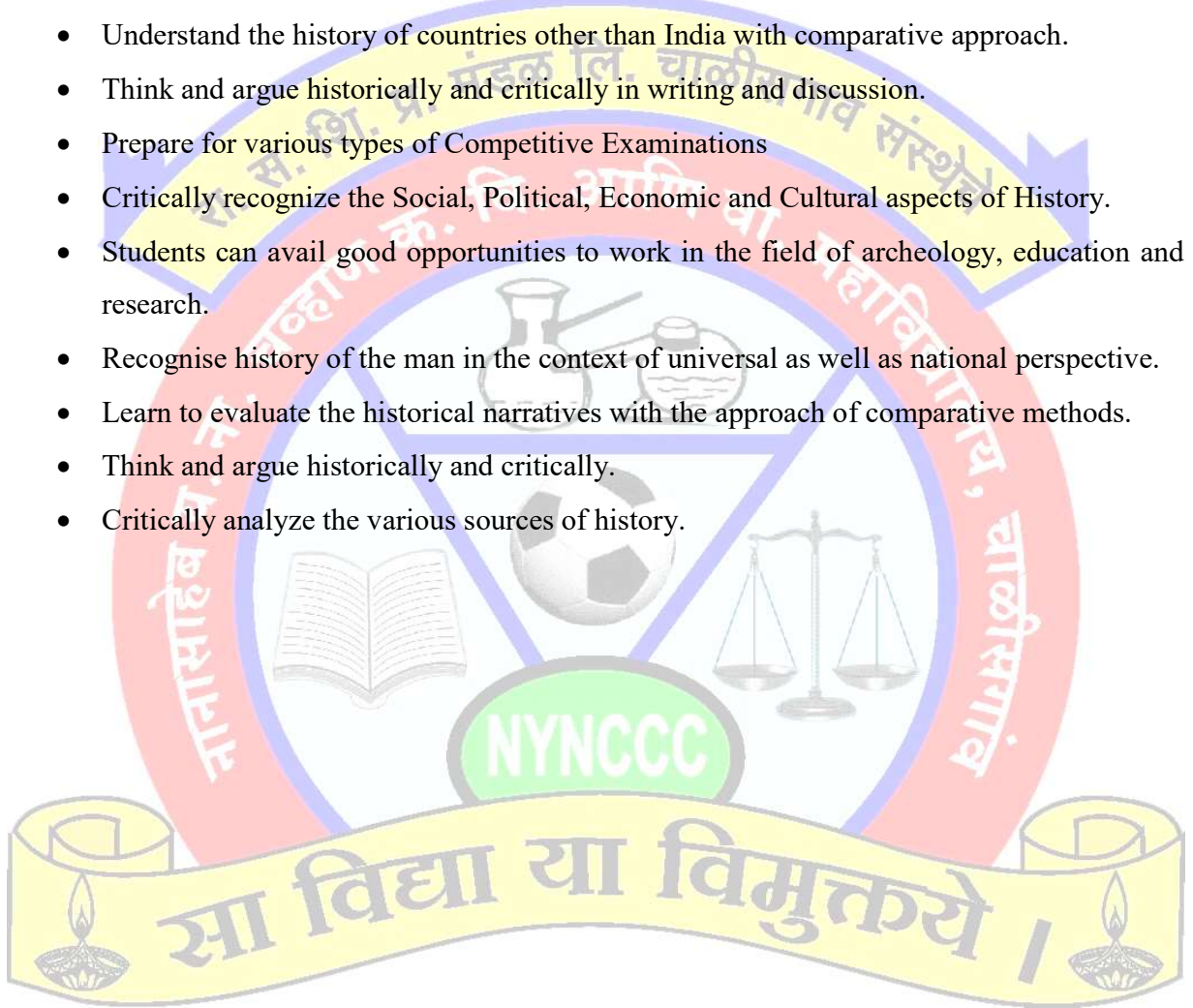


DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY
